

2020 Bon Accord Arena COVID-19 Guidelines

All Arena Users

- Stay home if you are sick or displaying any symptoms of COVID-19.
- Physical barriers will be in place to direct patrons to designated areas.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided at entry and exit points. Patrons are encouraged to bring their own for periodic use while in the designated area.
- As always, verbal and/or physical abuse to staff will NOT be tolerated. Patrons who engage in this behaviour will be asked to leave immediately and may be banned from the facility.
- Patrons should wash or sanitize hands frequently before leaving home, prior to entering the facility and after leaving the facility.
- Maintain 2-meter physical distancing between people where possible, except those who reside in the same household or who belong to an existing cohort.
- It is recommended anyone entering the facility wear a mask when physical distancing cannot be followed or in common areas. The mask can be removed once in the designated area and can practise physical distancing.
- Concessions are not available.
- No drop-in activities permitted.
- The facility will promote physical distancing by designating one-way traffic signage to reduce interactions between groups. Please follow the directional arrows and all other posted notices.
- All users are encouraged to use their own washrooms at home before and after an ice session to reduce touch points and transmission risk.
- There is a maximum of 100 people allowed in the facility at any given time as per AHS guidelines. Entrants will be counted to ensure compliance. Please limit exit and re-entry.

Organizations

- Individuals may enter the facility 15 minutes before their booking and must exit the facility 15 minutes after their booking.
- Teams are responsible for ensuring no more than 50 participants/spectators per team are in attendance to adhere to the maximum capacity of 100 people.

All organizations must follow the Alberta Return to Hockey Guidelines including, but not limited to:

- Designating a communications person who is responsible to update and circulate all relevant information to everyone within their jurisdiction, including facility staff.
- Keeping track of all participants for each activity for the purpose of contact tracing in the event
 of an outbreak. A member of the team or organization must be designated to keep track of
 names and contact numbers of all individuals at each event. Please refer to the AHS Guidelines
 for COVID-19 Relaunch Guidance for Sport, Physical Activity and Recreation Stage 2 for more
 information.

Players

- Players are encouraged to <u>arrive with their required equipment on</u>, as dressing room space will be extremely limited to provide greater physical distancing between individuals and groups.
- Hockey Canada is encouraging athletes to not bring hockey bags inside the facility.
- Showers are not available.

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- Indoor warm-up space is not available.
- Players must not spit, blow their nose freely or release any bodily fluid anywhere in the facility due to an extremely high risk of virus transfer.
- For age groups where parents need to assist with equipment, limit the number of parents in the
 designated area to one per player. During this time, masks MUST be worn by parents and
 players.

Spectators

- Spectators are strongly encouraged to wear a mask in common areas until physical distancing is possible.
- Common area chairs and tables will not be available.
- Cheering and yelling is strongly discouraged as it presents a high risk of spreading droplets. It is strongly recommended that spectators wear masks if unable to refrain from cheering.

Please note: The Town of Bon Accord will continue to monitor the virus and its impacts to public health, in partnership with the The Government of Alberta and the Government of Canada. As the COVID-19 situation changes, our guidelines for the Bon Accord Arena may change upon short notice.
