NEW BUSINESS

DARK SKY AD HOC COMMITTEE Terms of Reference

Hereafter referred to as the "Committee"

Mission: To affirm the Town of Bon Accord's commitment to preserving the night sky by embracing the principles of dark sky preservation and to maintain the quality of its night sky for generations of children and stargazers to come.

Through education, promotion, advertising, and events (within staffing and budget capacity) the Committee will assist the Town to develop and maintain a strategy to continue our International Dark Sky Designation.

Purpose: The primary goal of the Committee is to make recommendations to Council on public education, partnerships, events, and projects designed to stop reduce the increase of light pollution in our community and preserve our International Dark Sky designation.

Organization:

The Committee will consist of not fewer than five members appointed by the Community Services Advisory Committee Board for a term of no more than three years.

Membership shall include:

A minimum of Two members of Town administration as appointed by the Town Manager. will be Town of Bon Accord employees appointed by the Town Manager.

A minimum of One member shall also be a member of the Community Services Advisory Board as appointed by resolution of the Board.

No public Members?

Meetings:

Committee meetings will be held three times per year, or as called for by the Town of Bon Accord or the Committee.

Meeting procedures are governed by the Town of Bon Accord's Procedural Bylaw.

All Town of Bon Accord Board or Council Committee members are required to adhere to the Code of Ethics established in the Code of Ethics and Council-Town Manager Covenant Policy.

Chair or Vice Chair?

Meeting Minutes—who will record? I would suggest that the Town will maintain the meeting minutes including as per the Records and Retention Bylaw.

Role of the Municipal Committee: Whereas the Town has the ultimate authority to make decisions and provide a budget, the Committee will note provide input to administration on the following:

A. Objectives

- To ensure the ongoing and annual accreditation of the To assist the Town with developing activities that will help maintain the International Dark Sky designation and assist with the annual reports.
- 2. To assist the Town by providing input on the promotion of the Dark Sky designation as a valuable asset in a sustainable manner in accordance with the Town of Bon Accord's Strategic Plan.
- B. Reporting—This is the role of the administrative representatives on the Committee through to the Community Services Advisory Board and the role of the Community Services Manager to report to Council.
 - 1. Advise the Town Council regularly on activities—regularly needs to be defined.
 - 2. Not represent themselves as having any authority beyond that which the Community Services Advisory Board or Council Council delegates—this has to do with authority, not reporting. There are perhaps other clauses that would be appropriate—not committing to spend money on behalf of the Town for example.
 - 3. The Committee will satisfy reporting and other accountability requirements through the presentation of the minutes of each meeting of the Committee. What reporting requirements? Administration would report to the CSAB and to Council. What reporting requirements and accountability? I don't think we would ask volunteers to do that.

When using a template, it is important to consider our context and purpose in our context.

C. Terms

- These Terms of Reference shall be for a three-year period starting July 1, 2023 and ending July 1, 2026 unless otherwise determined by the Community Services Advisory Board or Council.
- 2. No later than January 1, 2026 (6 months in advance of termination of these Terms of Reference), the Town will negotiate a replacement document.

We don't negotiate with our own Committee.
